BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT PROGRAM



The Bereavement Program at Partners Hospice is designed to help people cope with the feelings that may follow a loss and to provide support through this period.

Services Offered to the Grieving Include:

MAILINGS

We provide educational and supportive information about coping with loss, along with invitations to our bereavement services and events.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

We offer bereavement counseling sessions with professional staff or a specially trained volunteer. These private sessions can be held in the home, at our Waltham office, or over the phone.

SUPPORT GROUPS

Our educational seminars and support groups provide a safe place to talk about personal experiences and help people learn to cope with their feelings. All groups are facilitated by licensed professionals.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

We hold workshops throughout the year on special topics, such as "Navigating Your New Life," and "Coping with the Holidays."

MEMORIAL SERVICES

Once a year, a Service of Remembrance is held for families. This non-religious ceremony is a time to remember loved ones and offers the chance to grieve your loss with others.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW . . .

Bereavement services are open to individuals of all ages and backgrounds who have experienced the loss of a child, spouse, parent, or other family member or friend.

All bereavement services are free of charge as part of the hospice benefit. Services are provided for up to 13 months following the loss of an adult and up to three years following the loss a child.

OTHER RESOURCES . . .

The Bereavement Program provides many free resources including informational tools such as brochures, books, and "grief bags". Support from our donors helps to make all of this possible.
